The Blind Vietnamese Children Foundation is a non-profit organization that supports health, education, and career development programs that enhance the quality of life of visually-impaired children residing in Vietnam.

It was a blessing for the Blind Vietnamese Children Foundation that at the beginning of the year, after the Board meeting on 12 January 2024, there was a fundraising of BVCF on 21 January, at the Golden Sea Restaurant in Orange County, California. In this fund raising and during the first half of 2024, BVCF has received donations from around the States, all of which have been sent to Vietnam to support blind children.

In April, I went to Vietnam to visit the projects. There were several members of BVCF and benefactors who joined in the trip. All of us were very happy to see blind children enjoying living and learning at various homes for the blind supported by BVCF, to see they are growing up and developing well.

The trip started with a visit to Long Thanh Home for the Blind in Dong Nai province, where some children go to ordinary primary school and others attend special classes. The group also did a home visit to see a blind boy with cerebral palsy in a rural area, to give his family financial support. After that, we visited Nhat Hong Home for the Blind in Thi Nghe, Saigon, where blind students stay and go to high schools, colleges and universities, and also work in a bakery. On behalf of BVCF, the President delivered scholarships for these students in higher education programs.


Then the group went to ThienAn Home for the Blind in Tan Phu district, where there were many blind children with music talents. They study in different schools, from primary to secondary, high school and universities. With scholarships for higher education from BVCF, these students will be able to continue their study and have a brighter future. The day ended with a visit to the Traditional Medical Clinic in Thu Duc, where graduated blind people are working. The clinic provides health services to 150-200 patients per day. Blind staff are able to earn their income and live independently, as well as to support other blind children in their study.

Continuing on the road, the group visited Da Lat Home for the Blind to see blind children, especially those from minority people. As in other places, blind children here attend ordinary schools or special classes happily and joyfully. After that, the group visited Suoi Mo Home for the Blind in Bao Loc, to see blind children with severe multiple disabilities. It was very difficult to gather these children to be with visitors, but it was exciting to see they can communicate with others in their own ways.

The trip ended with a visit to Vi Thuy Home for the Blind in Hau Giang province. This location provides care and education for blind children in several provinces in the Mekong Delta. Some of students go to ordinary school, others attend special classes and rehabilitation programs. In this village by the river, blind children live happily and enjoy their daily living activities.

Even though the group did not have enough time to visit all projects, we did get reports from other projects, and we could see the life of blind children has become better and better. Thank God, and thank all of you for your generosity and support, so that BVCF can provide more financial support to blind children in Vietnam. May God bless you and yours.


